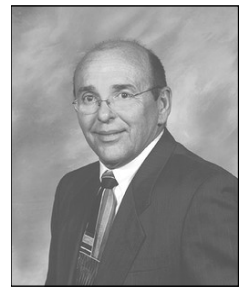

Fill your shoe box with hygiene items, school supplies, small toys, socks, coloring books, hair bows, flashlights, etc.

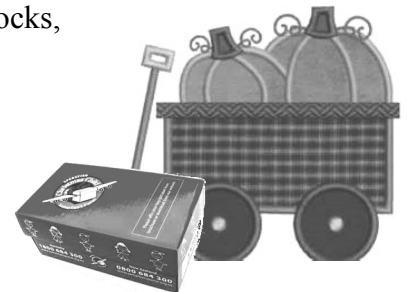
Add a “wow” gift: a doll, a stuffed animal, a game, a football, etc.

Be sure to add love and prayers!

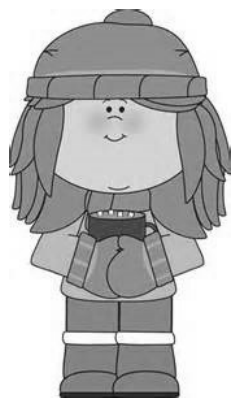
Bring your shoebox to the church by November 15, label it boy or girl and the age group.

You may wrap the box, but please wrap the lid separately.

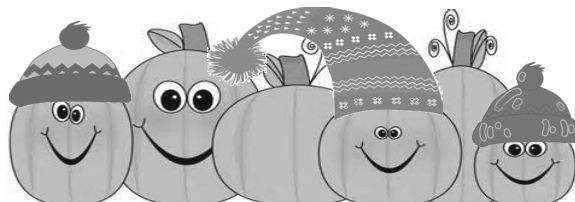
Somewhere around the world your gifts will bring joy and hope to a child.

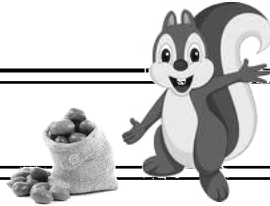
Nut Sale - Just in Time for Holiday Baking!

PUMPKIN & NUT RECIPES

PILGRIM PUDDING

Ingredients:

- 3/4 c. cold fat-free milk
- 1/3 c. canned pumpkin
- 2 T. sugar-free instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1/2 cup + 1 T fat-free whipped topping, divided
- 1-1/2 teas. fat-free caramel ice cream topping
- 1 teas. pecan pieces or chopped walnuts

In large bowl, combine milk & pumpkin. Add pudding mix, whisk for 2 minutes or until slightly thickened. Let stand for 2 minutes. Fold in 1/2 cup whipped topping. Spoon into desert dishes. Garnish with remaining whipped topping, drizzle with caramel topping and sprinkle with almonds.

Prep time: 10 minutes

PUMPKIN DUMP CAKE

Ingredients:

- 1 (29 oz.) can pumpkin
- 1 (12 oz.) can evaporated milk
- 3 whole eggs
- 1 c. sugar
- 3 teas. cinnamon
- 1 yellow cake mix
- 1 c. chopped pecans (optional)
- 3/4 c butter (melted)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Grease a 9 x 13 baking dish

In a large bowl mix pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar & cinnamon until well blended. Spread mixture in prepared baking dish. Mixture will be very wet. Sprinkle cake mix evenly on of the batter. Sprinkle pecans over the cake mix. Pour melted butter over the top of the cake mix. Bake 50 minutes. Cool, top with ice cream or whipped cream.
